


One of the strengths of the CareerTech System is its accessibility to almost every Oklahoman.

- CareerTech offerings in 394
 PK-12 school districts—1,358 teachers
- 29 technology center districts with 58 campuses—1,287 teachers
- Business and industry training attracts new industry and helps existing businesses expand and prosper—8,082 industries
- 16 skills centers (inmates/juvenile offenders) —37 teachers
- 32 adult basic education providers at 111 sites




Business and Industry Services



ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

Oklahomans are provided instruction annually through CareerTech's adult basic education programs.

- 32 ABE providers at 111 sites
- 7,751 students working on high school equivalency
- 4,310 correctional center students
- 586 English literacy/civics students
- 12,647 total students served
- 385,147* Oklahomans 18 years and older eligible for ABE services



CareerTech Skills Centers have served incarcerated inmates in Oklahoma for more than 40 years, offering programs and services for both adult and juvenile offenders.

DROPOUT RECOVERY

CareerTech's dropout recovery program helps students who drop out of high school earn their diplomas and gain skills to enter the workforce.

- 833 students 371 females, 462 males (460 dropped out before junior year of high school)
- 367 earned high school diplomas
- 4 passed high school equivalency tests
- 178 obtained employment
- 15 entered the military
- 94 enrolled in postsecondary education

PK-12 SCHOOLS (FY19)

135,088 ENROLLMENTS

CareerTech programs are available to students in sixth through 12th grades in Oklahoma's PK-12 schools.

- Thirty-five percent (121,159) of Oklahoma 6th-12th grade students enrolled in CareerTech courses.
- Forty-three percent (83,733) of Oklahoma 9th-12th grade students enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- There were 156,737 secondary CareerTech enrollments (some students take more than one offering).




ENROLLMENTS

In FY19 technology center districts operated on 58 campuses throughout the state, making services easily accessible to most Oklahomans. High school student enrollments in technology centers totaled 21,649. Adult enrollments in career programs, industry-specific training, adult and career development and Training for Industry were 386,714.



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DID YOU KNOW . . .

- Oklahoma CareerTech System graduates added more than \$3.5 billion annually to the state's economy.
- Oklahoma CareerTech annual enrollments totaled more than 558,000.
- Thirty-five percent (121,159) of Oklahoma 6th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech courses.
- Forty-three percent (83,733) of Oklahoma 9th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- More than 82,000 students learned important leadership skills in CareerTech student organizations.

- CareerTech helped 8,082 Oklahoma businesses increase sales, improve productivity, reduce costs and expand operations.
- Through 2,071 enrollments, Oklahoma CareerTech skills centers offered specialized training to adult and juvenile offenders.
- Student placement in FY18 was 94 percent (continuing education, employed and military).
- Oklahoma CareerTech students earned 19,566 industry-endorsed certificates in FY18.




Expenditures by Category from All Funding Sources (FY19 Actual)


