
One of the strengths of the CareerTech System is its accessibility to almost every Oklahoman.




Business and Industry Services

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

Oklahomans are provided instruction annually through CareerTech's adult basic education programs.

- 31 ABE providers at 116 sites
- 8,304 total students served
- 4,835 students working on high school equivalency
- 2,343 correctional center students
- 182 English literacy/civics students

DROPOUT RECOVERY

CareerTech's dropout recovery program helps students who drop out of high school earn their diplomas and gain skills to enter the workforce.

- 504 students 214 females, 290 males
- 233 earned high school diplomas
- 1 earned a GED
- 67 obtained employment
- 4 entered the military
- 54 enrolled in postsecondary education


PK-12 SCHOOLS (FY21)

ENROLLMENTS

CareerTech programs are available to students in 5th through 12th grades in Oklahoma's PK-12 schools.

- Twenty-nine percent (116,079) of Oklahoma 5th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech courses.
- Thirty-nine percent (77,115) of Oklahoma 9th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- There were 142,341 secondary CareerTech enrollments (some students may take more than one offering).


In FY 21, technology center districts operated on 59 campuses throughout the state, making services easily accessible to most Oklahomans. High school student enrollments in technology centers totaled 20,606. Adult enrollments in career programs, industry-specific training, adult and career development and Training for Industry were 274,587.



DID YOU KNOW . . .

- Oklahoma CareerTech annual enrollments totaled 426.125.
- Twenty-nine percent (116,079) of Oklahoma 5th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech courses.
- Thirty-nine percent (77,115) of Oklahoma 9th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- More than 16,000 students investigated nontraditional careers through the VirtualJobShadow.com initiative. Oklahoma CareerTech plans to expand the program to reach more students.

- More than 79,000 students learned important leadership skills in CareerTech student organizations.
- CareerTech helped 5,670 Oklahoma businesses increase sales, improve productivity, reduce costs and expand operations.
- Through 893 enrollments, Oklahoma CareerTech skills centers offered specialized training to adult and juvenile offenders.
- Student placement in FY 20 was 93% (continuing education, employed and military).
- Oklahoma CareerTech students earned 14,885 industry-endorsed certificates in FY 20.





Expenditures by Service Delivery from All Funding Sources (FY21 Actual)







