
### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**


## **SYSTEM OVERVIEW (FY22)**

#### **CAREERTECH DELIVERS**

One of the strengths of the CareerTech System is its accessibility to almost every Oklahoman.

- More than 446,000 total enrollments in Oklahoma CareerTech offerings
- CareerTech offerings in 391 PK-12 school districts1,457 teachers
- 29 technology center districts with 60 campuses1,372 teachers
- ▶ Business and industry training attracts new industry and helps existing businesses expand and prosper – 6,671 companies served
- ▶ 15 skills center sites (inmate/juvenile offenders)− 33 teachers



# ADULT EDUCATION AND FAMILY LITERACY

Oklahomans are provided instruction annually through CareerTech's Adult Education and Family Literacy programs.

- **▶ 32** AEFL providers at **115** sites
- ▶ 8,925 total students served
- ▶ 4,740 students working on high school equivalency
- **▶ 2,125** correctional center students
- **▶ 2,094** English literacy/civics students

#### **DROPOUT RECOVERY**

CareerTech's dropout recovery program helps students who drop out of high school earn their diplomas and gain skills to enter the workforce.

- **▶ 514** students: **235** females, **279** males
- ▶ 239 earned high school diplomas
- **▶ 2** earned a high school equivalency
- **▶ 114** obtained employment
- **▶ 12** entered the military
- ▶ 74 enrolled in postsecondary education

➤ CareerTech programs are available to students in fifth through 12th grades in Oklahoma's PK-12 schools.

- ➤ In FY22, 31% (127,875) of Oklahoma 5th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- In FY22, 42% (83,580) of Oklahoma 9th−12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- > There were **127,875** secondary CareerTech enrollments (some students may take more than one offering).





# DID YOU KNOW?

- ➤ Oklahoma CareerTech annual enrollments totaled **446,940**.
- ➤ Thirty-one percent (127,875) of Oklahoma 5th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- ➤ Forty-two percent (83,580) of Oklahoma 9th-12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.
- More than 95,000 students learned important leadership skills as members of co-curricular CareerTech student organizations.
- ➤ Oklahoma CareerTech helped more than 6,600 businesses increase sales, improve productivity, reduce costs and expand operations.
- ➤ Through 1,045 enrollments, Oklahoma CareerTech skills centers offered specialized training to adult and juvenile offenders.
- Oklahoma CareerTech programs had a 91% positive placement rate in FY21, which means nearly all CareerTech graduates found employment, entered the military or continued their education.
- Oklahoma CareerTech students earned 18,229 industry-endorsed certificates in FY22.






