- Training Day

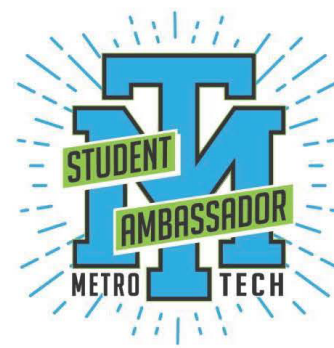


District Support

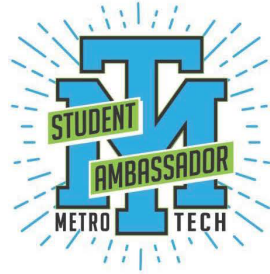

Code of Conduct



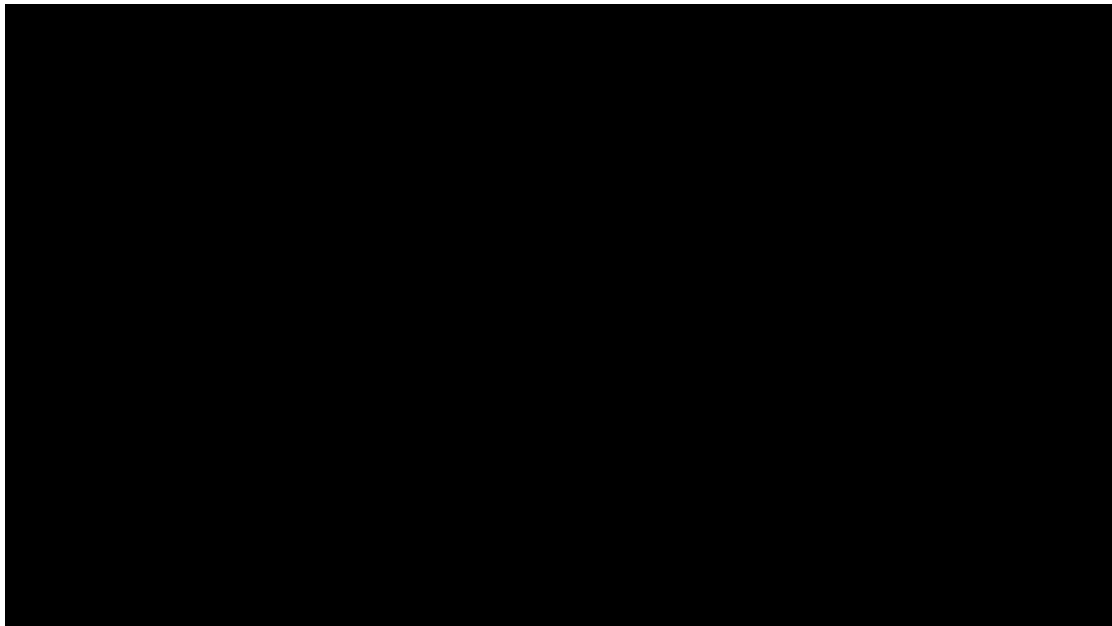
- ✓ I will volunteer at a minimum of 6 district/requested events

- ✓ I will wear my Metro Tech Student Ambassador t-shirt or hoodie when volunteering at district events



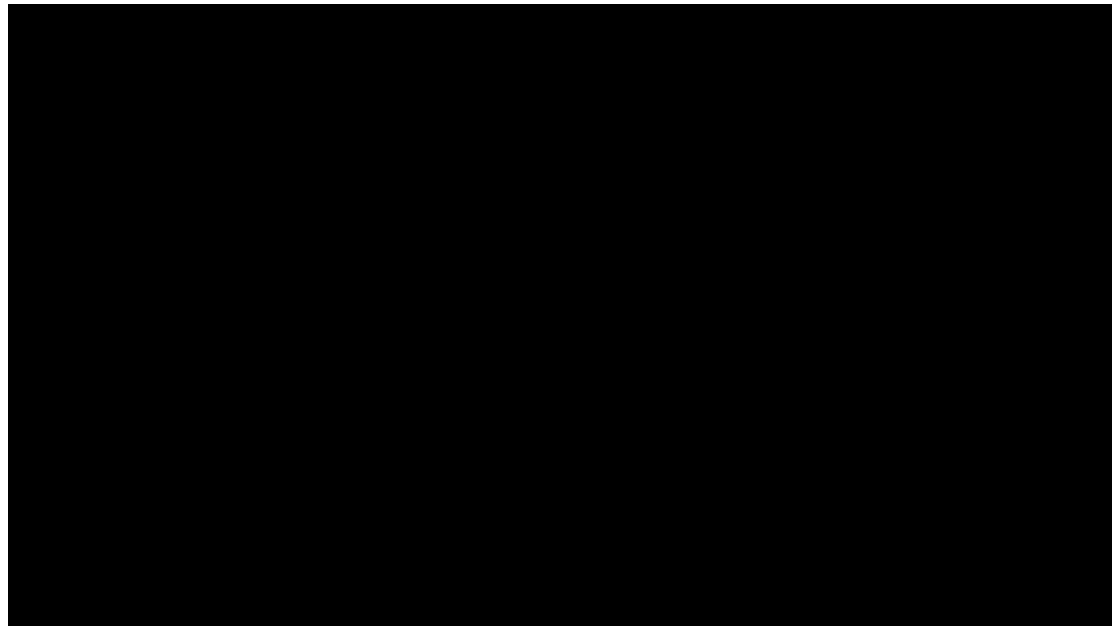

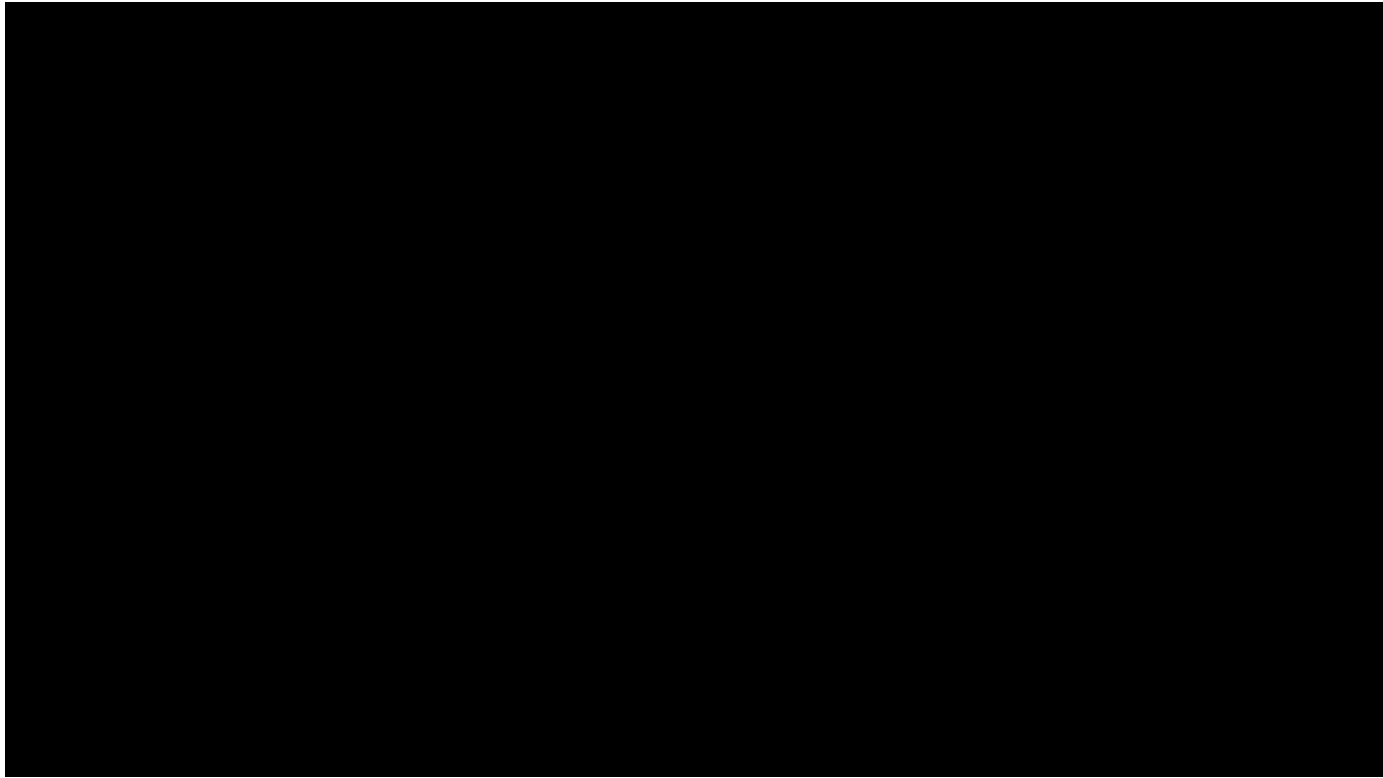
