
\blacksquare Instructions \blacksquare

- 1. Place voted ballot(s) in the Ballots Envelope.
- Place sealed Ballots Envelope in Affidavit Envelope.
- Place completed and witnessed Affidavit Envelope containing the Ballots Envelope inside the Return Envelope.
- 4. Seal the Return Envelope, affix postage and mail.



Voting and Preparing Your Ballot(s)

- If you have questions about your ballot(s) or ballot materials, immediately contact your County Election Board.
- Ballot(s) must be marked with blue or black ink.
- 3. If you cannot mark your ballot(s) yourself, you may choose an assistant to mark them for you. (See #7 below.)
- Marked ballot(s) must be sealed inside the Ballots Envelope.
- 5. The Affidavit Envelope must be:
 - a. Filled out completely and signed; and
 - b. Signed by two witnesses. (See #8 below.)
- If you cannot fill out your own Affidavit Envelope, an assistant may complete the Affidavit Envelope at your direction.
- 7. An assistant must:
 - a. Read the Assistant's Oath;
 - b. Print and sign their name in the space provided; and
 - c. Print their address in the space provided.
- 8. Each witness must:
 - Sign and print their name and address;
 - b. Not be a candidate for an office on the ballot;
 - c. Not be related to a candidate;
 - d. Not act as an assistant; and
 - e. Not witness the signatures of more than five absentee voters.

Returning Your Ballot(s)

If you are physically incapacitated or you are caring for a person who is physically incapacitated, your ballot(s) can only be returned by mail and NOT by hand delivery.

To return by mail to your County Election Board:

- Follow instructions entitled Voting and Preparing Your Ballot(s) on Page 1.
- 2. First-class postage must be affixed to the return envelope.
- Ballot(s) must be transmitted by United States mail or by a private mail service that provides delivery documentation. You must mail your own ballot(s).
- To help ensure delivery of your ballot(s) by the deadline, the USPS recommends that you mail your ballot(s) at least 7 days prior to the date of the election.
- Ballot(s) must be received by your County Election Board no later than 7:00 p.m. on election day. A postmark prior to 7:00 p.m. on election day will not suffice.

Warning

Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes provides that any person shall be deemed guilty of a felony who:

- Votes more than once at any election.
- Willfully votes in an election that they know they are not eligible to vote in.
- Knowingly votes and/or submits an absentee ballot issued to another person.
- Swears or affirms a false affidavit.
- Knowingly perpetuates fraud in connection with an election.
- Offers, solicits or knowingly accepts something of value intended to influence votes directly or indirectly.

The following Ballot Harvesting activities are unlawful: [Title 26 O.S., Section 14-101.1]

- Collecting an absentee ballot from another person with the intent to return the ballot on behalf of that person or,
- Submitting an absentee ballot on behalf of another person or,
- Requesting or receiving an absentee ballot on behalf of another person, or partially or fully completing an application for an absentee ballot on behalf of another person without that person's prior consent, or
- Notarizing or witnessing more absentee ballots than allowed by law.
