The Oklahoma Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Workgroup was developed to address Oklahoma programs focused on child sexual abuse prevention, prevention of problematic sexual behavior of youth, sex education, and/or healthy relationships for youth. One of Workgroup's goals was to develop an inventory of programs in Oklahoma designed to address at least one of these topics:

- **Prevention of child sexual abuse**
- **Prevention of problematic sexual behavior of youth**
 - **Sex education**
- **Healthy relationship building**

Childhood sexual abuse is a significant public health problem, with deleterious emotional, social, behavioral, and mental health outcomes for victims, The Oklahoma Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Workgroup was established to examine the efforts and gaps in addressing the prevention of child sexual abuse in Oklahoma. The Workgroup is composed of members from state and nonprofit agencies who has programs focused on child sexual abuse prevention, childhood problematic sexual behavior, sex education, and/or healthy relationships for youth. One of the initial efforts of the workgroup was to develop and distribute a survey to inventory and assess the gaps of child abuse prevention education and healthy relationship building services in Oklahoma. This directory of prevention services provides information about child sexual abuse programs in Oklahoma. For each program, the directory provides a description of the prevention program, targeted audience, topics addressed, counties served, ways to access the services and links to additional information. An annual update of the directory is planned.
