# What is the Personal Responsibility Education Program?

The Oklahoma Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP) helps educate young people on both abstinence and contraception to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including HIV/AIDS.

State PREP projects replicate effective, evidence-based program models or substantially incorporate elements of effective programs that have been proven to delay sexual activity and reduce pregnancy and STIs among youth. Oklahoma PREP is administered by trained health specialists in Oklahoma County and Tulsa County to primarily middle school and high school students.
