Welcome and Introductions:

Keith welcomed everyone. We did group introductions as we had a few new members. Keith pulled up notes from the last meeting to bring everyone up to speed. He reported that Dr. Reinschmidt has had 137 CHW dementia training participants.

Group Discussion:

- We have had trouble finding out exactly how many CHW, CHR and Promotores de Salud are in Oklahoma.
- Keith did a brief overview of what a CHW does- a liaison between a health system and patient population. In tribal communities they are called CHR and in the Hispanic community often are Promotores de Salud. Frontline health worker- not necessarily a trained practitioner, but they may be. Could be someone from the community, interested in the field that wants to help their community. Play a vital role in prevention, access, use, etc.
- We want to focus on the Community Health Worker training/certification.
 - o Dr. Reinschmidt has completed for ADRD specific training.
- Due to the hold on certification, should we think about other focus areas to offer training
 - Recommend 4 hours of training
 - Disclosure Form 613
 - If you claim you offer memory care, the form will have an area to tell what special training is offered to claim memory care
 - o Can we put in that if you claim to be a memory care that you must require certain training?
 - Minimum requirements we want staff to have....
 - Voluntary commitment and then eventually mandating it (2 SMART goals)
 - Dementia Friendly OK Voluntarily Commitment
 - Larger Workforce- CNA/CMA
 - Minimum required is 75 hours in their programs- 1 hour is required for ADRD specific training
 - Can we put in to add trainings
- Goal: By , increase frontline health workers in-service opportunities throughout the state.
 - Utilize the curriculum and trainings created by the Oklahoma Dementia Care Network and
 Project Echo for CNA/CMAs across the state to increase the utilization of their curriculum by %.
- Goal: By , provide ADRD specific certification for CHWs.
 - o Promote and utilize Dr. Reinschmidt's ADRD specific training for CHWs/CHRs.

Morgan and Keith will work on putting together the goals and objective verbiage to send to group for approval prior to submitting draft goals at the end of August.
