"We Exist to Stop Abuse"- A look at what we do.

Mission: Strengthening relationships and working to break cycles of child abuse and family violence.

Family Builders Provides 3 Programs: Parenting Classes, Batterer's Intervention Program and Community Education and Outreach

1. Parenting Classes

- Family Builder partners with DHS to provide families with open active cases, typically court-ordered. Voluntary Parenting classes are also available.
- There are two types of parenting classes:
- Parenting Skills Class:
 - 12-week course
 - Common Sense Parenting, Parenting 101
- Compassion Workshop:
 - 12-week course

- More personal and intimate
- Helps parents understand and deal with their own emotions
- Gives information on more effective ways to deal with stress

2. Batterer's Intervention Program (for batterer, not victim)

- 52-week course
- Services provided in Oklahoma, Logan, and Canadian Counties, but may soon expand to Pottawatomi County
- Is an evidence-based program
- While in the program, if a batterer has a setback anytime during the course, they will have to restart the program
- Intimate Partner Violence is the most common batterer in the programs

• Community Education & Outreach

- Talks about child abuse and neglect around the state.
- Co-parenting classes are now court ordered if child is less than the age of 18.
 - Parents are seen separately
 - Counseling and therapy provided
- Cost for Classes Contact: familybuildersok.org or (405) 232-8226
 - \$35 intake fee
 - \$25 per week out of pocket fee

Fees are based on a sliding scale, classes can be as low as \$10.

Safe Families host vulnerable children and create extended family-like supports for families in crisis through a community of compassionate volunteers. "We keep children safe and families intact."

Located at 3 East Main Street Oklahoma City, OK 73104

- Safe Families started in Chicago when the founder ran into a mom who was at her wits end and wanted help before her child was taken or abused. The founder and his wife kept the woman's child for a couple of months and was returned to their mother.
- Safe Families is a privately owned 501 C3 nonprofit and is based on the National Safe Families for Children model. They are trying to become an evidence-based program.
- Safe Families ended their pilot program July 2017
- Hosting a child costs on average \$1500
- Children have to have some type of medical insurance

Volunteers

- Volunteers are housed within local faith-based organizations
- Although only available in Oklahoma City at this time, legislation is statewide
- The program is designed to partner with other agencies such as schools or other familyoriented programs i.e. Positive Tomorrows
- All volunteers are trained
- All volunteers undergo a background and reference check (Angel Foster Network is used to screen families)

Who can participate?

- Parents who have gotten a job and can't afford child care
- Mothers who enter programs such as ReMerge where they will be away and need someone to care for the children
- Families that face homelessness and want a safe place for their kids to stay until parents can get back on their feet

- Goals
 - Keeping the families together
 - Families can reunify without a child abuse or neglect case
- Host Families
 - Will become Partial Power of Attorney of child
 - It does not take away parents' rights, just allows host family the ability to handle medical needs as well as school, etc
 - Are required to take a 3-hour online training course and a 3-hour in person training
 - No corporal punishment
 - Assistance from Circle of Parents
