- Those items will be given to charities.
- Participants will wear blue and see who the last person standing is for Child Abuse Prevention.
- Team lead is Kodi Pollard, Parent Promise and other team participants.
- Hospital Babies Cuddle Program Not a chosen activity, but discussed.
 - This program will allow member to become cuddlers for children who are in the hospital and do not have visitors or frequent visitors (young infants/toddlers left alone in cribs for long periods of time).
 - The hospital has strict guidelines so participants must be approved before volunteering.
 - Most of conversation tabled when other projects were chosen.


