



(McCurtain County E-911 Service Trust Authority) was voted in and put into place as of November of 2010. Funding has been implemented by a 10% landline surcharge for the base rate and .50 cent surcharge on each cell phone per month, and is currently being collected. Mapping and addressing services will begin within the next 30 to 60 days. If all goes as planned phase I will be in operation county-wide within 18 to 20 months.
