Okmulgee County EMS Plan

Okmulgee County Emergency Medical Services was established as a trust in 1974, it is basically funded by Medicare, Medicaid, and third party reimbursement. EMS also receives funding from four (4) cities, where the citizens of these four (4) cities pay \$3.50 on their water bill for ambulance service, (only citizens who live inside the city limits). There is also a membership that citizens who live in rural areas can obtain in the amount of \$42.00 per year.

Okmulgee County EMS covers 700 square miles. EMS has six (6) ambulances, four (4) of these six (6) ambulance's are running daily. EMS has a station in Henryetta, with two (2) employees working at all times, one being a Paramedic, and the other being either an intermediate or basic. There is also a station in Beggs with two (2) employees, one being a paramedic, and the other either a basic or an intermediate.

The EMS main office is located in Okmulgee at 1213 E. 20th. All calls come in at this location and they are dispatched out on all emergency calls and transfers.

EMS runs approximately 5000 runs per year. There are two (2) ambulances running at the Okmulgee location at all times, one being a transfer unit that basically transfers patients to Tulsa hospitals as well as making emergency calls in town.

Okmulgee County EMS has ten (10) Paramedics, twelve (12) EMT's that are either basic or intermediate technicians. Four (4) office workers and the director work at this location. Nine (9) part time EMT's for a total of thirty-six (36) employees.
