

Addendum to the 2010 Hospital Inpatient Discharge Data Manual – V.1

Condition Code P7

The National Uniform Billing Committee approved the discontinuation of Point of Origin Code 7 and issued a new condition code P7 effective July 1, 2010. **The information Point of Origin 7 Emergency Room is still required for state reporting and the requirement has not changed.** Collecting and mapping the P7 Condition code to the Point of Origin code 7 is the recommended method to accommodate the requirement.

Present-on-Admission Indicator

Present-on Admission (POA) indicator is required on all discharges from acute care medical surgical hospitals. Only one of the five valid values should be used. Valid values are

- Y: Present at the time of inpatient admission.
- N: Not present at the time of inpatient admission.
- U: Documentation is insufficient to determine if condition is POA.
- W: Provider is unable to clinically determine whether condition was POA or not.
- 1: Unreported/not used; exempt from POA reporting.

State licensed Critical Care Hospitals and Inpatient Rehabilitation Hospitals can use a POA “1” to indicate the exempt status. POA should be assigned to diagnoses including the E-codes according to the “ICD-9-CM Official Guidelines for Coding and Reporting”. No exemptions are made for bed types within acute care medical surgical hospitals.

Patient Address

Submission of the Patient Address is required. The field should indicate the physical address of the patient residence whenever one is available. Specifications to indicate homeless, out-of-country and unknown addresses are as follows

Homeless patients

Street Address: "Homeless"

City: City of Hospital. e.g. Oklahoma City, Lawton etc.

State: "ZZ"

Postal Code: "99990"

Out-of-Country

Street Address: Country of origin e.g. Mexico, Canada, etc.

City:"Out of Country"

State: "XX"

Postal Code: "99999"

Patients with Unknown addresses

Street Address: "Unknown"

City: City of Hospital. e.g. Oklahoma City, Lawton etc.

State: "ZZ"

Postal Code: "99990"

Physician Identifiers

Use OTH000 if the National Provider Identifier (NPI) of the physician is not yet available or is being processed by CMS

Social Security Number

Newborns whose mother's SSN is unknown use 200100 for the single newborn, for multiple births use 200101 for Baby A, 200102 for Baby B etc.
