A. Emergency Systems Quarterly Activity Report

Lori Strider announced two positions have been refilled at the Oklahoma State Department of Health Ms. Andrea Jordan has been named as the Quality Initiatives Manager and will also oversee stroke system development and Erica Buttman will be Plan Review Architect. For any questions relating to the Oklahoma EMS Information System (OKEMSIS), please contact Martin Lansdale. On November 6th, 2018 the numbers of runs that can be uploaded at one time is now 200 runs. Training for OKEMSIS will be available for 2019, but dates are still pending. Marva Williamson will be having webinars for Trauma Fund, dates pending. Daniel Whipple presented the TReC data showing the numbers EMS and hospitals have called in the last quarter.

The courses are Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) and Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition, and Stabilization (PEARS).

He stated the older generations are not able to bounce back from trauma, which can lead to further complications putting them at a higher rate for mortality.
