MINUTES

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 am

II. Roll Call

Roll call was taken and all the Board Members were present except for Alliance Health Durant and Atoka County Medical Center. See the attached attendance list for all members.

III. Welcome and Introductions

There were no introductions

IV. Approval of Minutes – February 14th, 2019

A motion was made to approve the minutes by Delbert Gay and seconded by Brad Smith. There was no discussion and the motion passed 14 - 0.

V. Reports/Updates

A. Emergency Systems Quarterly Activity Report

B. Quality Improvement Committee Quarterly Activity Report given by Brandee Keele Ms. Keele presented the new Quality Improvement Medical Records Request which is to streamline medical records back to Brandee so she can get more accurate information for review.

C. Regional Planning Committee Quarterly Activity Report

Ms. Beggs shared that the REPC group reviewed the Envenomation Plan and the Stroke Plan. Revisions will be brought back to the next REPC meeting for review and possible action to present to the RTAB

D. Regional Medical Response System Quarterly Activity Report

Ms. Beggs explained how each agency/facility could update their information for either cell phone or email addresses. Ms. Beggs also shared there was a coalition surge test conducted where AllianceHealth Durant was evacuated and the test went well.

E. EMS for Children Quarterly Activity Report

Delores Welch reported that EMS-C has provided more than 200 Pedi-Mate statewide to the ambulance services. She also updated the group about free training for Pediatric Advanced Life Support and Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition and Stabilization.

VI. Business

A. Discussion and possible action to propose recommendations post-Quarter 1 presentation on "Snake Bites"

Kari Beggs gave a report from the Regional Education Planning Committee about the discussion on the Envenomation plan for Region 5. The following changes will be made to the envenomation plan:

- Add Texoma Medical Center who is snakebite ready
- Add Paris Regional Medical Center who is snakebite ready
- Remove Latimer County General Hospital (closed) from all plans
- Update the number of vials for each snakebite facilities
- Add the number for Poison Control because they have up to date information
- Update the destination to be more accurate

B. Discussion and possible action about the Regional Education Planning Committee related to the lack of member participation and timely response to quorum poll.

Dean Henke gave the attendance report for 2018 and the first Quarter of 2019. The REPC only made quorum two times since February 8th, 2018. Two of the six members only attended one meeting since that time also. Grace Pelley insured that the REPC is very important to the RTAB. Delbert Gay said it is important to meet every quarter and for REPC members to attend. Ms. Beggs suggested we start with removing the member who did not attend today's REPC meeting and then move forward in 2019, and then take action on future attendance issues. C. Discussion about agencies updating their EMResource status and how to make improvements.

Ms. Beggs gave a report on the need of agencies and facilities to stay updated on EMResource. She also described how EMResource works in regards to users, passwords, and how to participate in the drills and surges test. Ms. Beggs stated that data gained from an incident is forwarded to the OSDH – Situation room and the Governor so they can determine what assistance is needed. Ms. Beggs said she can't rely on the information that is on EMResource because it is not accurate because it is not being updated. Ms. Beggs offered to set up classes for the group if they desired. No further action was taken.

D. Discussion and possible action related to regional stroke efforts:

- **1.** Establish a regional stroke workgroup to stay abreast of the changes at the Oklahoma State Stroke System Advisory Committee (OSSSAC).
- **2.** Consider a regional representative from the regional stroke workgroup to attend and represent Region 5 Southeast stroke concerns.

Ms. Beggs reported the following upcoming changes to the Stroke Plan:

- 1. Priority II patients with signs and symptoms of a stroke with a last known well time more than 4 ½ hours but less than 7 hours will be changed to 24 hours.
- 2. Priority III patients with signs and symptoms of stroke with a last known well time that is more than 7 hours will be changed to 24 hours.
- 3. Will review the accuracy of the stroke plan destinations.
- 4. New Level III and Level IV stroke algorithms will be sent to the region for review.
- E. For consideration and approval to retain Laura Lance as RTAB secretary on a voluntary Basis until the completion of her term 12/31/2019.

Laura Lance resigned so no action was taken.

VII. Presentation/Discussion

A. Capabilities of the Public Health Lab - OSDH

"Preparing for Chemical Emergencies" Public Health Lab (PHL) – OSDH- John Murray Mr. Murray presented to the group that there are 53 PHL across the United States. The OSDH PHL assists agencies with what to collect, how to ship samples, and how to develop a chemical response plan. He discussed multiple worst case scenarios and problems that could arise. It was suggested that each agency conduct their own drills to test their readiness for a chemical emergency.
