Take Charge!

Take Charge! is a statewide program which provides eligible Oklahoma women with breast and cervical cancer screening.

Take Charge! performs the following:

- -Clinical Breast Exams
- -Mammograms
- -Pap Tests
- -Pelvic Examinations
- -Diagnostic Testing (if results are abnormal)
- -Treatment Referrals
- -Patient Navigation

Take Charge! has screened 68,426 women since initial funding in 1995.

Take Charge! is funded by a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP), State Funding and the Breast and Cervical Cancer (BCC) Revolving Fund.

Women served is defined as screening and diagnostic services provided and paid for solely by NBCCEDP funds or in part by NBCCEDP funds and other funding sources as listed above.

About the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP) provides consumer education, free and low-cost breast and cervical cancer screenings, and diagnostic services to low-income, uninsured, and underserved women. The NBCCEDP provides funding to all 50 states, the District of Columbia, 5 U.S. territories, and 12 American Indian/Alaska Native tribes or tribal organizations. Since 1991, NBCCEDP grantee programs have served more than 3.7 million women, and provided more than 9.2 million breast and cervical cancer screening examinations.

Federal guidelines establish eligibility to uninsured and underinsured women at or below 250% of federal poverty level, ages 18–64 for cervical cancer screening and 40–64 for breast cancer screening.
