The Oklahoma School Security Institute **(OSSI)** was created by the Oklahoma State Legislature in the Spring of 2013 and officially became a division of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security **(OKOHS)** on July 1, 2013.

The OSSI acts as the central resource for the public and private elementary and secondary schools of this state. You can contact the OSSI for information on resources to enhance school security and assess risks and threats to school campuses.

The goals and objectives of the OSSI include, but are not limited to:

- Maximizing school security training and support to public and private elementary and secondary schools as well as technology centers;
- Assisting and supporting school administrators as needed in the development and implementation of safety drills;
- Facilitating efforts of public and private elementary and secondary schools to utilize any available programs or entities specializing in security issues; and
- Creating and coordinating working groups in order to continue developing and implementing new strategies and techniques for future recommendations on school security issues.

The OSSI manages Tipline.ok.gov where reports of activity that may compromise school safety can be submitted and disseminated to appropriate parties for additional investigation, should it be warranted.

Tipline.ok.gov provides a form that is available 24/7 on any computer or mobile device so information can be relayed directly to school administrators and law enforcement. Communication personnel man this line so that time sensitive information can be forwarded quickly and effectively to the appropriate authorities for timely intervention.
