# Troubleshooting

# Troubleshooting Detective Work

- Identify and specifically define the problem
- Try to reproduce the issue
- Notice when the problem occurred
- Search for a solution and test it

# Basic Troubleshooting Solutions

- Restarting
- Inspect cables
- Verify settings
- Check for updates
- Task manager/force stop
- Clear cache
- Uninstall/reinstall

# Troubleshooting Practice

# More Practice

# Algorithms in Searching

- Search engines collection information to prioritize your search results based on your:
  - Search/browser history
  - Location
  - Language
  - Device
  - Personal information

# Internet Safety

- Phishing – Emails or messages pretending to be from a credible person/organization that ask for personal information or money
- Viruses – Malicious code that replicates itself and changes how the computer/program works
- Malware – Software specifically designed to gain access or damage a computer system
