Chairman Hiatt,

We are writing to you today in order to draw your attention to an issue that is central to the thousands of energy employees of northeastern Oklahoma, many of which are represented by the companies signed below. The primary duties of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission ("Commission"), are to regulate oil and gas development, protect correlative rights and prevent waste throughout the great state of Oklahoma. While the Commission has offices both in Tulsa and Oklahoma City, we believe the office in Tulsa has been understaffed for some time and is now being forced to navigate a relocation of its offices which have significantly impacted the operations of many oil & gas companies in northeastern Oklahoma. By our collective review of the statute<sup>23</sup>, Tulsa's Commission office is currently understaffed by at least one office administrator, one hearing officer (administrative law judge), and one secretary.

We greatly value the contributions made and the efforts put forth by the Commission's employees in Tulsa. The administrative law judge, clerks, and court reporters work diligently and with due process to serve the citizens of our state and to adjudicate the matters that the undersigned companies (and many others) set forth before them. However, in recent years, it is our opinion that the office is and has been under supported by the Commission and the State as a whole.

We reviewed the Commission's conservation docket filings in 2019 and found there were 10,866 applications where a court location was identified. Of those 10,866 applications, 3,860 were filed in Tulsa which represents about 35% of the total conservation docket applications. Tulsa currently has one administrative law judge to hear all the causes filed in Tulsa. By contrast, Oklahoma City currently has 9 administrative law judges on the conservation docket. This translates to the judge in Tulsa performing over three times the work of her peers.

The understaffing of the Tulsa office manifests itself in many ways but most poignantly it affects the ability of the employees of the companies represented below (and many others) to schedule and hear causes on the protested docket. Due to limited staffing, these contested cases often must be scheduled months in advance with final orders issuing several months after testimony was actually presented. This practice often leaves the affected parties in a perilous environment and makes business planning increasingly difficult due to the uncertainty and timing of the outcome of the cases.

One of the strengths of Oklahoma's oil and gas business community has been the efficient nature of the Commissions' actions that have provided certainty to those companies, their employees, owners and the mineral and royalty owners who thrive on the development that they create. We are collectively concerned that if the efficiency of the Tulsa office is allowed to further erode and/or remain in a state of diminished staffing, the footprint of Tulsa's oil & gas community may shrink as the correlative commitment to regulatory access does. This will undoubtedly prove damaging to a major pillar of the economic development base of northeastern Oklahoma and make Tulsa a less attractive place for oil and gas companies to operate.
