COVID-19 OUSF Emergency Response Results

The Emergency Bandwidth response process that was established to facilitate the availability of adequate broadband services for hospitals, schools, and libraries during this historically challenging time has now come to a close.

As a result of this process, over 100 Hospitals, Schools, and Libraries successfully requested and received increases in bandwidth during the emergency period, from March 2020 to June 2022.
