#### NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT

In order to comply with the requirements of Section 2 of the Oklahoma Senate Bill 808 ("OK Siting Laws"), which was approved by the legislature and signed by the Governor, and in advance of certain rules that are to be promulgated by the Oklahoma Corporation Commission ("Commission") pursuant to the passage of SB 808, Infinity Renewables, LLC, on behalf of Willow Creek Wind Project, LLC hereby informs the Commission of its intent to construct the Willow Creek Wind Project (the "Project") located in Noble and Pawnee Counties, Oklahoma.

The project has been under active development for several years. The most recent FAA form 7460-1 filing was made on June 6, 2016. A summary of the June 6, 2016 FAA form 7460-1 fillings for each wind turbine tower location within the Project boundary is attached as Exhibit A. Exhibit B to this letter presents a diagram showing the real estate analyzed and included in statutory setback compliance. As of the date of this notice and based on publicly available data, Company attests that the Project design complies with the setbacks required by the OK Siting Laws.

In accordance with the OK Siting Laws, Infinity Renewables, LLC also confirms it is submitting a notice of intent to construction to the Board of the Noble County Commission, the Board of the Pawnee County Commission in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C.
