

CHECKLIST FOR LICENSING IN OKLAHOMA
UNDER THE INTERNATIONAL FUEL TAX AGREEMENT
(IFTA)

In order to obtain an IFTA License in Oklahoma, the applicant must have a “Qualified Motor Vehicle” which meets the requirements of the agreement.

A Qualified Vehicle means

A motor vehicle used, designed, or maintained for the transportation of persons or property, occurs mileage in Oklahoma, *and*

- has two axles and a gross vehicle weight or registered gross weight exceeding 26,000 pounds or 11,797 kilograms; *or*
 - has three or more axles regardless of weight; *or*
 - is used in combination when the weight of such combination exceeds 26,000 pounds or 11,797 kilograms gross vehicle weight or registered gross vehicle weight.

- passenger vehicles that have seats for more than nine (9) passengers in addition to the driver.

Is Oklahoma your base jurisdiction for IFTA Licensing?

Oklahoma is your base jurisdiction for IFTA licensing and reporting interstate motor carrier activity if:

- Your qualified motor vehicles are IRP registered in Oklahoma; *or*
- You have an established place of business in Oklahoma from which motor carrier operations are performed; *and*
- You maintain the operational control and operational records for qualified motor vehicles in Oklahoma or can make those records available in Oklahoma.
