

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program Goal on Federally-Assisted Opportunities with Federal Transit Administration

Federal Fiscal Years 2023, 2024 & 2025

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Introduction

This report details the Oklahoma Department of Transportation's (ODOT) process for setting the Federal Fiscal Years (FFYs) 2023, 2024 and 2025 overall goal for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation on Transit related opportunities.

The goal setting methodology complies with the DBE rule set forth in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), 49 Part 26.45. This submission includes a description of the methodology used to establish the goal, including the base figure and the evidence by which it was calculated, evidence relied upon for any adjustments to the base figure, and a projection of the portions of the overall goal expected to be met through Race Conscious (RC) and Race Neutral (RN) measures, respectively.

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation's (ODOT) submits the following Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal methodology for 2023 - 2025 to the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Federal Transportation Administration (FTA) for review in accordance with 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 26.45, as amended by Docket No. OST-2010-0021. The goal will remain in effect until the next review cycle. ODOT will make a good faith effort to meet the goal each year. To ensure overall quality of the information and data used in the goal setting methodology, ODOT will continue to review and refine, as needed, its data collection process and analysis, and engagement with stakeholders and the public.

The goal methodology consists of two steps: the base figure for the relative availability of DBEs and any adjustments to the base figure based on available evidence. In Step 1, the base figure is established through the use of the Oklahoma Unified Certification Program (OUCP) DBE directory and 2020 United States Census Bureau data. In Step 2, ODOT reviews and considers available information and new evidence presented in public consultation meetings when determining an adjustment to the base figure. The base figure and the adjustments to the base figure are then used to determine the overall goal. The overall goal is further defined as race-neutral and race-conscious based on the amount of DBE participation that ODOT plans to meet through race-neutral means.

To engage the public, ODOT provided two types of opportunities for public participation. The first opportunity included a virtual public consultation meeting. The public was invited to discuss evidence that would influence the relative availability of DBEs or other issues that influence DBE participation. In the second opportunity, the methodology was posted on ODOT's website for a period of 30 days and public consultation letters were issued to stakeholders, to allow for public review and comment.

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Description of Methodology

Proposed DBE Goal for Federal Fiscal Years 2023, 2024 & 2025

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposes the following goal for participation by DBEs on transit related opportunities for FFYs 2023, 2024 & 2025:

Race Conscious (RC) - 3.1%

Race Neutral (RN) - <u>.3%</u>

Total DBE Goal - 3.4%

ODOT's overall goal provides for the participation of all certified DBEs. The overall goal is not subdivided into group-specific goals (see §26.45(h)). The Overall Triennial Goal Methodology includes the following (see §26.45(f)(3)):

- Establishing the relevant Market Area
- Description of the methods used to establish the goal,
- Step 1: Determination of a Base Figure (26.45), relative availability of DBEs to all comparable firms (DBE and Non-DBEs) available to propose
- Step 2 Adjustment analysis
- Race-Neutral Race-Conscious Split
- Public participation overview in accordance with §26.45(g)

I. Establishing the Relevant Market Area

ODOT's local market was determined by identifying where the substantial majority of ODOT's contracting dollars are expended and/or where the substantial majority of contractors and subcontractors' bids or quotes are received. ODOT analyzed data, which found that the substantial majority of contractors and subcontractors' bids or quotes were received from firms located within the geographic boundary of the State of Oklahoma. Therefore, the State of Oklahoma was determined to be the relevant market area.

II. <u>Step One Base Figure Section 26.45(c)</u>

In determining the available pool, the relative availability (percentage) of DBEs in Oklahoma and surrounding states that apply for grants was determined. ODOT utilized the list of sub recipients that received FTA grant funds specifically for administrative, capital purchases and operating expenses. Information on the sub recipients is tracked and monitored by ODOT's Office of Mobility & Public Transit Division through an online database management system called Making Your Life Easier Online (MYLEO.net). The total amount of federal funds anticipated to be distributed was \$28,215,480.70, with a total of \$24,555,480.70 distributed to in-state sub recipients.

A total amount of \$28,215,480.70 of FTA assisted contract funds was distributed by project. To establish ODOT's Base Figure of the relative availability of DBEs to all comparable firms (DBE and Non-DBEs) available to propose on ODOT's FFY 2023/25 FTA-assisted contracting opportunities projected to be solicited during the respective goal period, ODOT followed one of the five prescribed federal goal-setting methodologies in accordance with 49 CFR Part 26 regulations. ODOT utilized Method 2 to determine our goal (Use DBE Directories and Census Bureau Data), this was accomplished by accessing the Oklahoma Unified

Certification Program (UCP) Directory of Certified DBE Firms and the 2020 U.S. Census Bureau County Business Patterns (CBP) Database.

Table 1 below illustrates the project categories as well as the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes aligned with the scope of work anticipated for each project found within the Oklahoma Unified Certification Program (UCP) Directory of Certified DBE Firms and the 2020 U.S. Census Bureau County Business Patterns (CBP) Database. Each NAICS code was then weighted based on the funds anticipated for that NAICS category within each project.

To determine the relative availability of DBEs, ODOT divided the numerator representing the ratio of ready, willing, and able DBE firms, by the denominator representing all firms (DBE and Non-DBEs) available in each work category, see below:

Number of Ready, Willing and Able DBEs = DBE Availability % Number of All Available Firms (DBEs and Non-DBEs)

ODOT made a concerted effort to ensure that the scope of businesses included in the numerator was as close as possible to the scope included in the denominator. For corresponding detail of all work category classifications grouped, refer to Table 3 below.

- For the numerator: Oklahoma UCP DBE Database of Certified Firms
- For the denominator: 2020 U.S. Census Bureau's Business Pattern Database (CBP)

To determine the appropriate weighting percent by NAICS, the estimated dollar value by NAICS was divided by the total estimated federal dollars for FFY 2023/25. The weighting percent by NAICS was then multiplied by the DBE Availability % to determine the Base Figure % by NAICS, see below:

Weighting X DBE Availability % = Base Figure % by NAICS

To determine the Step 1 Base Figure, ODOT added together all Base Figure percentages by NAICS in Table 2 below, resulting in a Step 1 Base Figure of 6.58%.

III. Step Two: Adjustments to the Base Figure Section 26.45(d)

Upon establishing the Base Figure, ODOT reviewed and assessed other known evidence potentially impacting the relative availability of DBEs within ODOT's market area, in accordance with prescribed narrow tailoring provisions set forth under 49 CFR Part 26.45 Step 2; DBE Goal Adjustment guidelines.

Evidence considered in making an adjustment to the Base Figure included ODOT's Past DBE Goal Attainments, Evidence from Disparity Studies conducted in ODOT's market area, and Other Evidence, as follows:

A. Past DBE Goal Attainments

ODOT considered an adjustment to the Base Figure based on the median DBE participation on DOT-assisted contracts completed within the past four FFYs (2018/21). The following table below reflects the demonstrated capacity of DBEs (measured by historical DBE participation) on FTA-assisted contracts awarded by ODOT within the last four Federal Fiscal Years:

In 2020-2021, the COVID-19 pandemic caused a significant disruption for transit operators. Many ODOT subrecipients struggled to maintain service during this time. Federal stimulus funds were provided by CARES to capital, operating, and other departments to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19. As a result, external contracting activities were significantly reduced, lowering opportunities for DBE participation.

By using a median of just the last three years, the extreme outliers caused by atypical conditions would be eliminated and only the middle year, which was the start of the pandemic, would be used for comparison. Utilizing a four-year period allowed ODOT to more accurately compare a pattern of DBE participation over a time with normal contracting activity and also represents contracting activity that is more consistent with what is anticipated over the next three federal fiscal years.

The median established for the past four years is lower than the Base Figure derived from Step 1; therefore, an adjustment to the Base Figure based on ODOT's past DBE goal participation has been made. As four years of DBE Participation data was reviewed and the years reviewed included projects with a similar variety in scope to the scopes projected for the 2023/25 period, ODOT can reasonably assume that the rates of DBE participation reflected are an accurate reflection of DBE capacity to perform in the 2023/25 overall goal period. The adjustment is calculated in accordance with FTA guidance by averaging the Base Figure with the Median DBE Past participation, as shown below.

6.58% Base Figure + .29% Median Past Participation = 6.87%

6.87/2 = 3.44%

Adjusted Base Figure: 3.4% (Rounded to the nearest tenths)

Pursuant to DOT guidance, ODOT is adjusting the Step 1 base figure by using the median DBE participation of .29%. This was averaged with the base figure of 6.58% resulting in a revised overall annual DBE goal of 3.4%.

B. Evidence from Disparity Studies, Barriers to Entry: Employment, Self-Employment, Education and Training, Business Ownership Rates and Access to Capital

Colette Holt & Associates was retained by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation ("ODOT") to perform a disparity study (Disparity Study) of its contracts funded by the Federal Highway Administration in conformance with strict constitutional scrutiny and the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("DBE") program regulations at 49 CFR Part 26. The Disparity Study determined ODOT's utilization of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises during fiscal years 2015 through 2019; the availability of these firms as a percentage

of all firms in ODOT's geographic and industry market areas; and any disparities between ODOT's utilization of DBEs and DBE availability. Although the Disparity Study was conducted on Highway-related projects as opposed to transit-related projects and scopes, the Disparity Study heavily focused on procurement and contracting processes, procedures and practices and gathered input from stakeholders regarding those processes, procedures and practices and their impact to DBE availability which would apply in ODOT's Transit Program.

Additionally, ODOT consulted other recipients within Region 6 to identify if Disparity Studies within the market area were available for transit-related projects and did not identify any available Disparity Studies within Region 6.

ODOT's Disparity Study satisfies legal standards and guidance from the U.S. Department of Transportation concerning the implementation of race-conscious application, and ODOT has elected to utilize this study as a basis for continuing to implement the race-conscious component of their Overall DBE goal. ODOT will ensure that the use of race-conscious goals is narrowly tailored and consistent with other relevant legal standards.

C. Other Evidence

ODOT did not receive any anecdotal evidence nor is it aware of any other factors or adverse considerations that would have had a material effect on DBEs availability within ODOT's marketplace, or on DBEs' ability to participate (meeting bonding, insurance, and financial requirements) in ODOT's FTA-assisted contracting programs at this time.

However, as part of ODOT's 30-day period public facilitation process, it will request comments/input from industry groups both representing DBEs and non-DBEs to determine whether further consideration in making an adjustment is warranted. ODOT will also consider input received through disparity studies in ODOT's market area. The Overall DBE Goal for FFY 2023/25 goal period for ODOT's FTA-assisted contracts is 3.4 percent.

The proposed goal further serves to identify the relative availability of DBEs based on evidence of ready, willing, and able DBEs to all comparable firms, which are known to be available to compete for and perform on ODOT's FTA-assisted contracts. The proposed goal reflects a determination of the level of DBE participation, which would be expected absent the effects of discrimination.

IV. Race Conscious and Race Neutral Projections

DOT has identified that the amount of past participation obtained using DBE subcontractors on contracts without DBE goals should be considered achieved race/gender-neutrally and that those attainments can be used as a basis for estimating a similar level of race/gender-neutral participation in the next overall goal period.

Therefore, ODOT considered the amount of past DBE subcontractor participation on contracts without

DBE goals in FFYs 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 below:

A DBE participation value of 0.29 percent was derived by the utilization of DBE firms in the Race-Neutral (RN) periods above. ODOT confirmed that the projects completed during FFYs 2018 through 2021 were similar to the types of projects being procured in the upcoming overall goal period, a required criterion for consideration in utilizing DBE prime participation to validate race-neutral application. As 0.29 percent DBE participation was achieved on like-projects during the attainment period reviewed, ODOT concluded that this rate of DBE participation would be an accurate reflection of DBE subcontractor's capacity to perform race-neutrally in the 2023/25 overall goal period. ODOT has applied this to the proposed DBE Goal to project the necessary race-conscious/race-neutral breakout, as illustrated below:

.3% RN Projection (Rounded to the nearest tenths)

DBE Goal: 3.4%

RN Application .3% / RC Application 3.1%

Consistent with the DOT guidance provided, and the reasons delineated above, ODOT has found it advisable to implement the race-neutral/race-conscious breakout illustrated above to meet the proposed Overall DBE Goal of 3.4% in accordance with 49 CFR Part 26.51.

ODOT will continue to monitor its DBE participation during the overall goal period to determine whether the application of ODOT's race-neutral/race-conscious measures to meet the proposed Overall DBE Goal of 3.4 percent remains on target. ODOT will adjust the application of race/gender-neutral and race/gender-conscious measures, as necessary to ensure ODOT meets the maximum feasible portion the overall goal by using race/gender-neutral means of facilitating DBE participation.

V. Public Participation and Facilitation

In accordance with Public Participation Regulatory Requirements of Title 49 CFR Part 26.45(g), minority, women, local business chambers, and community organizations within ODOT's market area were consulted and provided an opportunity to review ODOT's goal analysis and provide input.

The public participation process included the following:

A. Consultation. A virtual public meeting was held on December 15, 2022. Information regarding the

public meeting was posted on the ODOT Contract Compliance Division's website and sent within the Public Notice. Three people joined the virtual public meeting and asked general questions about the DBE program.

B. Published Notice. The proposed goal methodology report along with an electronic comment form was posted on the ODOT Contract Compliance Division's website, emailed to all whose email address was registered to receive updates from ODOT, and emailed to the Association of Oklahoma General Contractors (AOGC) and American Counsel of Engineering Consultants (ACEC) for additional notification to its members. The notice informed the public of the proposed goal and its rationale. The notice also stated that the report was available for inspection during normal business hours and that comments would be accepted through the end of the public comment period. Comments received from the virtual public meeting and the on-going consultation were reviewed and considered but determined no adjustment was needed to the 3.4% Overall Goal (RN Application .3% / RC Application 3.1%).
