Dear Mr. Wilkinson:

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) is doing an alteration project within the City of Oklahoma City. I have been working with T.J. Dill and we need a resolution from the City to complete the project. There are certain aspects of the project that we feel we cannot bring into ADA compliance without going beyond our scope of the project. In these cases, ODOT requires the municipality to provide ODOT with a resolution committing their ADA responsibilities. This resolution shall include a description of the scope that you have committed to, as well as a schedule to start and complete this scope. The resolution shall also be included within your City's ADA Transition Plan. This will allow the resurfacing project to proceed as scheduled and will not result in a delay in the project. In addition, lack of participation may jeopardize future federal or state participation in capital improvement projects located within the public rights-of-way.

Please see below for the project issues:

- North Tulsa Avenue, North St. Clair Avenue and North Portland Avenue:
 These areas have no existing pedestrian walkways with a prepared pedestrian surface for pedestrian use or Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS). However, there is a crosswalk, which will not be put back after the overlay, as we do not want to invite pedestrian activity where it is not safe.
- Meridian Avenue:

This area has minimal pedestrian walkways with prepared pedestrian surfaces for pedestrian use. Also, there are existing APS in all four corners, as well as the medians with crosswalks. ODOT <u>will</u> re-stripe existing crosswalks. The main issue for this intersection is drainage.
