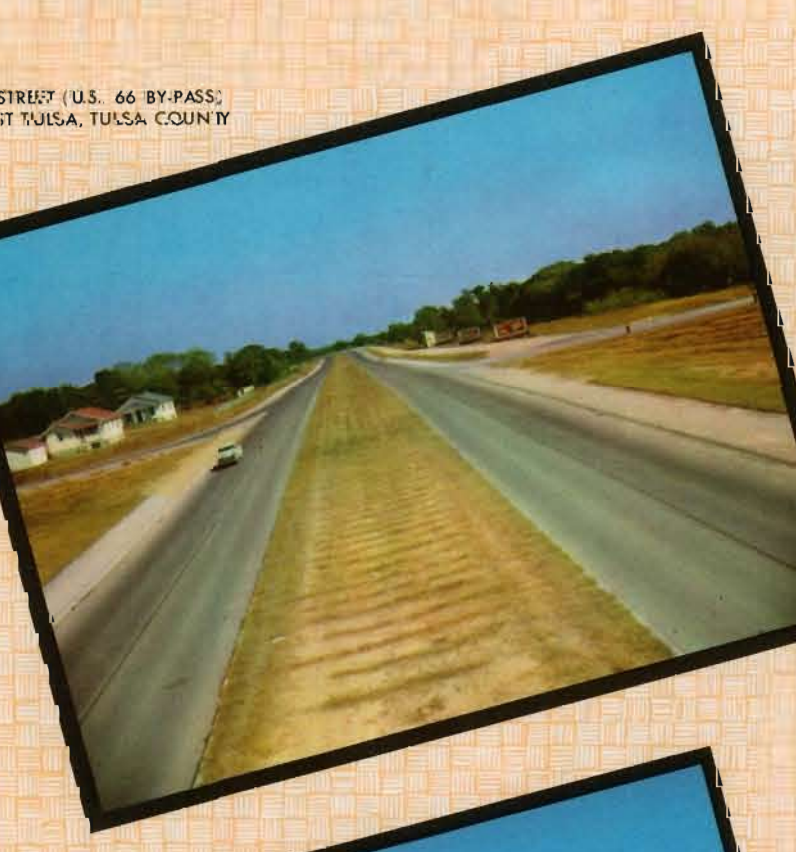


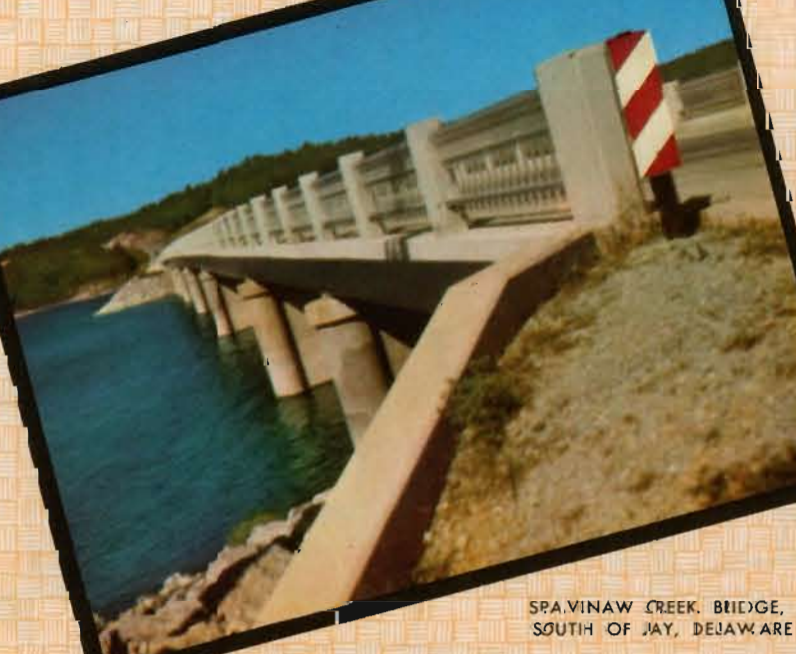
KINROSS CREEK BRIDGE, U.S. 81 NORTH OF KINROSSER, KINROSSER COUNTY



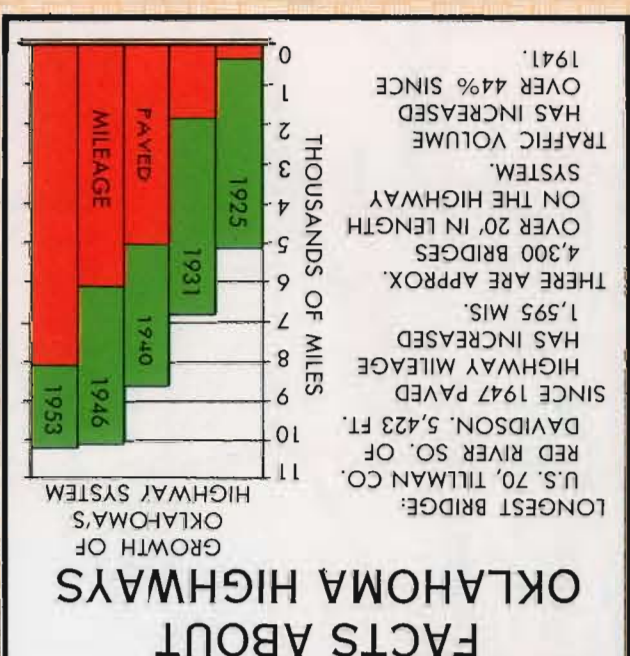
REBURNS ALONG U.S. 27 IN MURRAY COUNTY



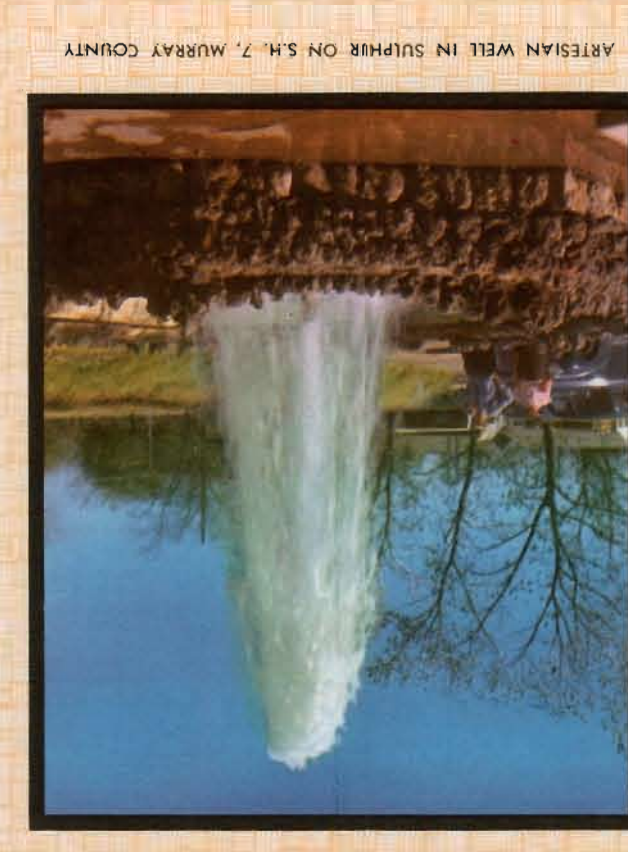
SPAVINAW CREEK BRIDGE, U.S. 59 SOUTH OF JAY, DELAWARE COUNTY

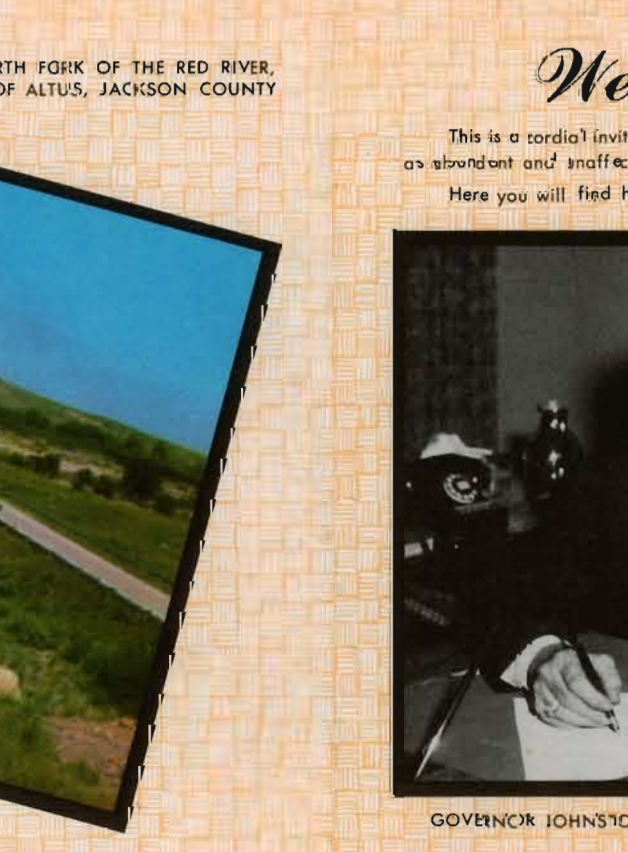

WINTERS INTERCHANGE, U.S. 66 BY-PASS, OKLAHOMA COUNTY

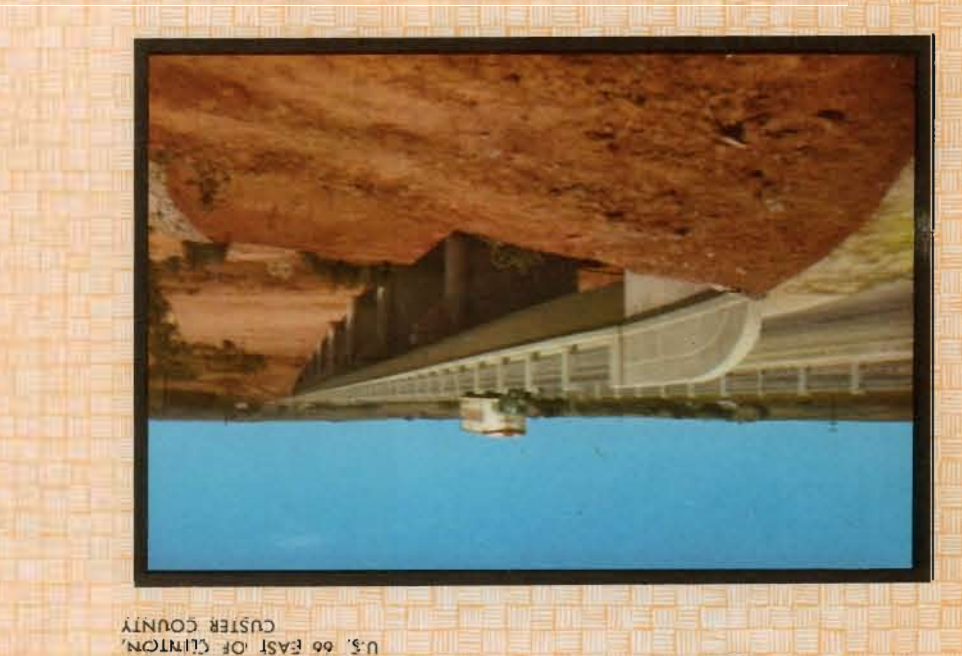

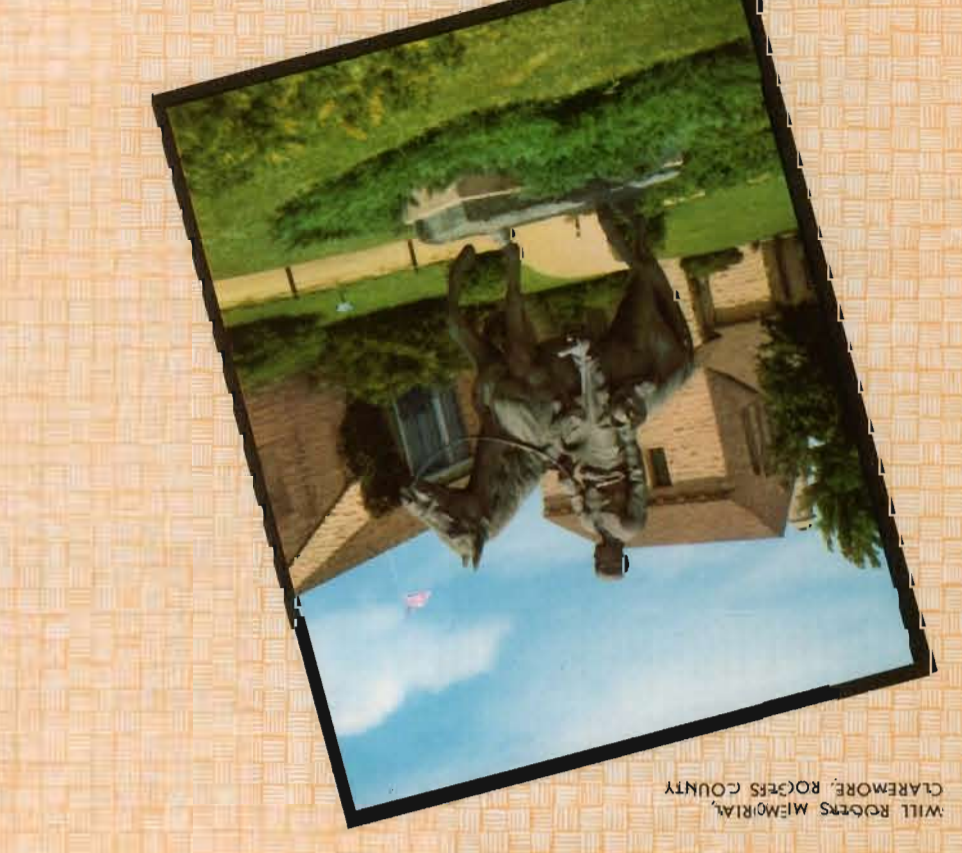
