FHWA is pleased to inform you that ODOT's TAMP previously certified by our Office on 8/29/2018 and implementation documentation for Year-2021, dated June 10, 2021, with modifications/revisions submitted on June 24, 2021, meets the FHWA guidelines for consistency determination per 23 U.S.C. 119 and 23 CFR part 515 and complies with the minimum requirements set forth in 23 CFR 515.13(b)(1) and implementation regulations in 23 CFR 515.13(b)(2).
