The Oklahoma Department of Human Services is committed to improving the safety, permanency, and well-being of children served by the child welfare system. The Pinnacle Plan is the roadmap, and public reporting is critical to ensuring transparency and accountability. The OKDHS Metrics, Baselines, and Targets Agreement -3/7/13 outlines how the outcomes are measured and reported. Monthly, Quarterly, and Biannual Reports will be made available to the public. Beginning in July 2013, monthly updates will be posted on the 20th day of each month or the following business day.

Oklahoma is committed to good faith efforts and positive trending toward the goals outlined in the plan. Each monthly report will include four performance areas, comprised of ten specific metric elements. These are: Foster Care Safety, Counts for New Foster Homes, Worker Contacts, and Shelter Usage. In addition to metrics public reporting, OKDHS posts The Pinnacle Plan - Quarterly Updates which provide valuable information regarding plan initiatives.

Demographics of children are included in monthly and semi-annual reports as context data. This information is helpful in understanding the population being served by the child welfare system.

OKDHS was the first state agency to have a federally approved statewide automated child welfare information system (KIDS System) and continues to strive for high quality data. The data in this report is subject to change due to ongoing data entry, changes in definitions, and/or data quality issues that may be discovered through the process.





Data: The Maltreatment in Care Measure by Resource Caregiver incorporates a 90-day delay from the time the investigation is complete to the report date. This delay allows for the Appeal/Program review process to be completed which may result in changes in the findings. The data reflects substantiations in the month that the investigation was completed and not necessarily in the month that the abuse or neglect occurred. This measure includes all children placed in foster care homes and kinship homes, which are relative placements. Oklahoma began including children substantiated of maltreatment by the Office of Client Advocacy in institutional settings in March 2013.

Comments Sep 2013: In May 2013 there were a total of 40 victims of maltreatment while in out of home care. These 40 victims were reported in 10 separate referrals of children in foster care and 10 referrals to OCA. Of these 20 children in Out of Home Care, 10 were placed in Kinship Foster Care Homes, 8 children were placed in Therapeutic Foster Care Homes, and 2 were placed in a Regular Foster Home. On the 20 OCA victims, 12 were placed in Group Homes, 4 were placed in a Hospital/Inpatient Facility, and 4 were placed in Non-DHS Operated Shelters.



Data: The Maltreatment in Care by Parents measure incorporates a 90-day delay from the time the investigation is complete to the report date. This delay allows for the review process to be completed which may result in changes in the findings. The data reflects substantiations in the month that the investigation was completed and not necessarily in the month that the abuse or neglect occurred. This is an unduplicated list of victims, thus a child will only be counted once on the most recent confirmed referral in the month. The Federal government requires that the agency report on all children in DHS custody, regardless of when the abuse or neglect occurred.

Comments Sep 2013: Of the 14 reported victims in May 2013, 3 of those children were reporting on abuse by a parent that occurred prior to coming into DHS custody.








Data: The Data reflects the total number of required visits due to children in out of home care and the number of total required visits made by the primary assigned worker for a given month. Only one visit per month by the primary worker is counted even though multiple visits may have been made by multiple workers during the month. For SFY14, the interim target is 70%.

Comments Sep 2013: The worker visitation rate for primary workers in August 2013 was 71.4%.

5.1: Shelter Use – Age 0-1 Years






Data: Data shown for the number of children will count some children more than once if their shelter stay extended from one month into the next. This Pinnacle Plan Measure was implemented 12/31/12. Automatic exceptions will be made for children in the following circumstances: If the child is part of a sibling set of 4 or more, a child placed with a minor parent who is also in DHS custody, or medically fragile children requiring 24 hour care.

Comments Sep 2013: In August 2013, 28 children age 0-1 years spent a total of 179 nights in the shelter. Of these 28 children, 8 met the automatic exception as part of a sibling set of four or more, 1 child was part of a sibling set of four or more and met the automatic exception as medically fragile, and 1 child was placed with a minor parent in DHS custody.

5.2: Shelter Use – Age 2-5 Years






Data: Data shown for the number of children will count some children more than once if their shelter stay extended from one month into the next. The Pinnacle Plan commitment to stop the use of shelters for children age 2-5 years was implemented on 7/1/13.

Comments Sep 2013: In August 2013, 80 children, age 2-5 years spent a total of 758 nights in the shelter. Of these 80 children, 19 met the automatic exception as part of a sibling set of 4 or more.

5.3: Shelter Use – Age 6-12 Years







Data: Data shown for the number of children will count some children more than once if their shelter stay extended from one month into the next. The Pinnacle Plan commitment to stop the use of shelters for children age 6-12 years will be implemented beginning 7/1/2014.

Comments Sep 2013: In August 2013, 235 children, age 6-12 years spent a total of 3449 nights in the shelter.
