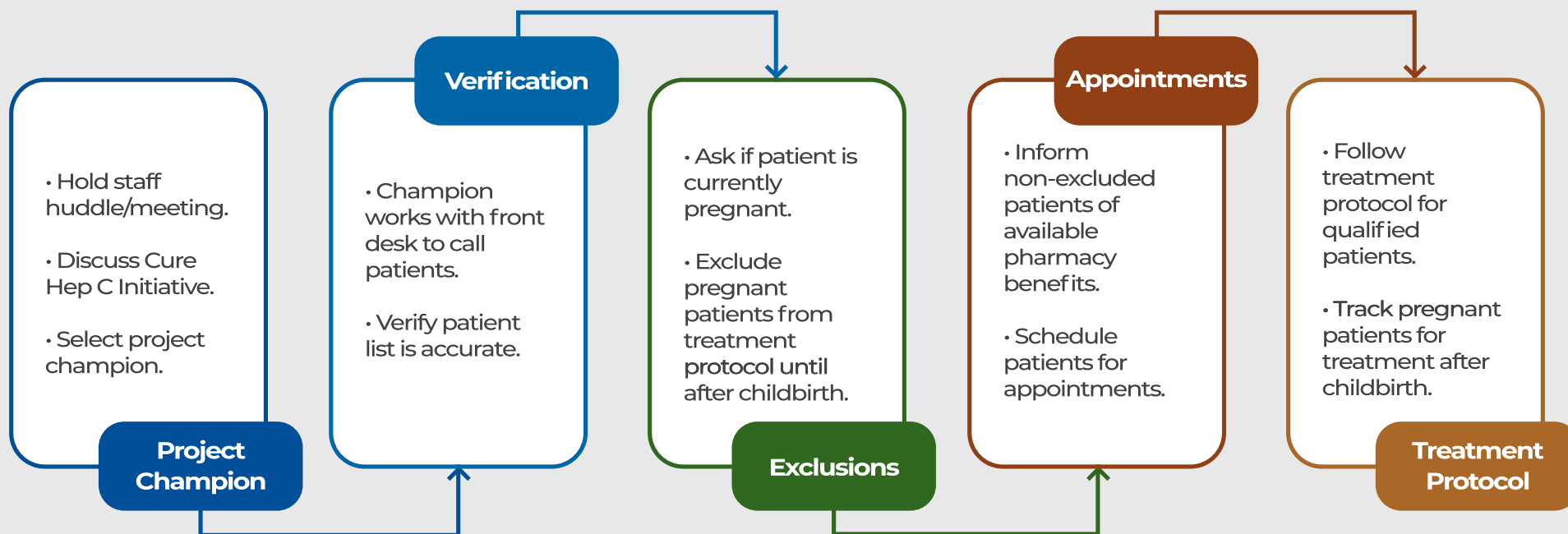


# Cure Hepatitis C Initiative: Suggested Clinic/Practice Workflow



• There is little to no evidence to support the treatment of pregnant women with direct acting antivirals (DAA). Thus, pregnant women should be excluded from treatment protocol until after childbirth.

Protocol	Process
<b>1. Select Project Champion</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Hold a staff huddle or meeting</li> <li>2. Discuss Cure Hep C Initiative.</li> <li>3. Select project champion</li> </ol>
<b>2. Verification</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Project champion works with front desk to call patients.</li> <li>2. Verify patient list is accurate, i.e., patients are still a part of the provider's panel.</li> </ol>
<b>3. Exclusions</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Ask if patient is currently pregnant.</li> <li>2. Exclude pregnant patients from treatment protocol until after childbirth.</li> </ol>
<b>4. Appointments</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Inform non-pregnant patients of available pharmacy benefits.</li> <li>2. Schedule patients for appointment.</li> </ol>
<b>5. Treatment Protocol</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Follow treatment protocol for qualified patients.</li> <li>2. Track pregnant patients for treatment after childbirth.</li> </ol>
