I/T/U SHARED SAVINGS PROGRAM

What is SoonerCare I/T/U Shared Savings Program?

The I/T/U Shared Savings Program directs the reinvestment of any savings to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) generated by enhanced federal matching — as authorized under Section 1905(b) of the Social Security Act — at a rate of one hundred percent (100%) for covered services received through participating Indian Health Service, Tribal and Urban Indian (I/T/U) facilities.

SoonerCare makes it possible for Oklahoma I/T/U providers to receive shared savings when an American Indian and Alaska Native is referred to a non-Indian health provider under a care coordination agreement between IHS/tribal providers and the non-IHS providers.

Provider Requirements for Participation

- 1 Participation by providers and patient must be voluntary.
- 2 Services outside IHS must be provided via a written care coordination agreement with referral from IHS.
- 3 IHS must maintain responsibility for patient care.
- 4 Medical records must be shared with IHS.
