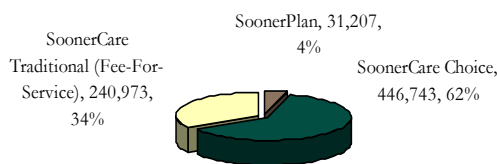

Please note some Child/Parent member eligibility was extended during the September Online Enrollment transition period. Therefore, we are continuing to experience a decrease in enrollment.

OTHER Group includes—DDSD State-PKU-Q1-Q2-Refugee--SLMB-Soon to be Sooners (STBS) and TB patients. The Total Enrollment figure makes up 433,789 cases. A case is used to group members of the same family living in the same household.

Note that all subsequent figures are groups within the above total enrollment numbers (except Insure Oklahoma). SoonerPlan (Family Planning) members are not entitled to the full scope of benefits only family planning services are covered.

The Insure Oklahoma is a program to assist qualifying small business owners, employees & their spouses (Employer Sponsored Insurance—ESI) with health insurance premiums and some individual Oklahomans (Individual Plan—IP) with limited health coverage. www.insureoklahoma.org

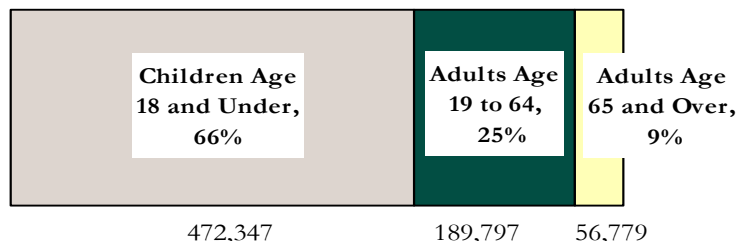

Age Breakdown of Total Enrollment

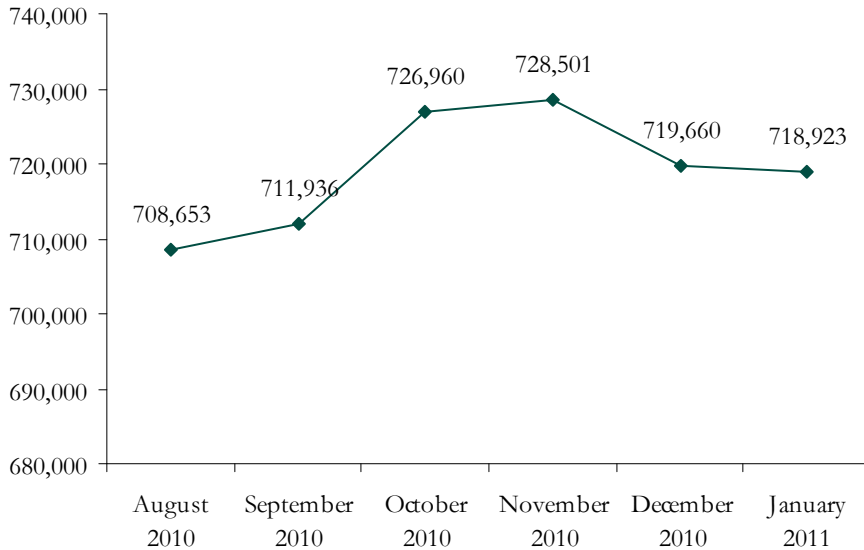

Ring in the New Year with Quality Health Coverage for Oklahoma's Children

OKLAHOMA CITY – As we roll into the New Year, we vow to stick to those New Year resolutions. For some it may be eating healthier, working out or keeping up with routine doctor visits. But for a child without health insurance, this can be a challenge.

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority has launched an initiative called SoonerEnroll to ensure that qualified children have access to quality health care.

More than 480,000 Oklahoma children are currently enrolled in SoonerCare, Oklahoma's Medicaid program. According to U.S. Census Bureau estimates, another 60,000 children qualify for SoonerCare but are not enrolled. SoonerCare provides children with free health and dental benefits.

"The physical and mental health of a child can have a significant impact on his or her ability to be successful in school and in life; yet many do not have sufficient access to quality health care," said Ed Long, project director of SoonerEnroll. "With SoonerEnroll, we are making a concentrated effort to let people know SoonerCare is available if they qualify."

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority wants to help families start the New Year with healthy kids and enrolling them in SoonerCare and ensuring routine check-ups are a step towards that goal.
