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September 2013 Medical Advisory Committee Proposed Rule Change Summary

13-08 Systems Simplification Implementation—Eligibility policy is amended to implement Systems Simplification Implementation effective October 1, 2013, instead of January 1, 2014. Rules are also revised to delay periodic renewals that would fall during the period January – March, 2014 until April, 2014, and to delay the effective date of terminations of SoonerCare eligibility for reasons related to changes in household composition or income until April, 2014 when the agency is redetermining eligibility based on changes in circumstances from January to March, 2014. These emergency rule revisions allow the State to correct regulatory complications created by federal rules; they implement a waiver of the federal requirement that the State use two sets of financial eligibility rules for pregnant women and families with children from October 1, 2013 to March 31, 2014, thereby avoiding serious prejudice to the public interest.
